Having Confidence

We as musicians are our own worst critics. We hear all of our mistakes and dwell on them, often times, too much. Performing is a mental activity just as much as a physical one. Sometimes that mental aspect gets the better of us. Confidence comes with experience and although you can't gain experience overnight, here are some things that will ensure a better performance and build confidence in your playing or singing.

▶ Practice - This is probably the most

important of all. The more familiar you are with your music, the better your chances are for a good performance. Listen to your teacher and practice the way they tell you to. This usually involves slow tempos and repetition of difficult parts in the music.

- **Centering Yourself** -Never start a piece until you are mentality ready. Take a few seconds to breath and relax. This will seem like an eternity in front of an audience. Don't worry about it; just take that little bit of time for yourself and you will feel more comfortable, confident, and at ease during your performance.
- Don't dwell on mistakes or missed notes Just keep going. Dwelling on a mistake will only have a negative effect on the rest of your piece. I am really impressed with SAMA students during recitals. Whenever a student makes a mistake, they just keep going.
- ▶ **Perform** -Take every opportunity to perform in front of an audience. It could be your family, friends, a talent show at school or especially our SAMA recitals.
